I am one of the program's "failures," and dropped out after about three years. My [grounded theory] research was with the transplant and renal dialysis teams at Moffit looking for a calculus of social worth in the life and death decision-making processes within the medical community... I burned out.

I know it's a bit of imposition, but I have a correction for Kathy's obit. In today's digital world, these errors become sticky. On page three, the caption identifying the first cohort members of the sociology program mis-identifies me as a "Robert Broadhead;" it's actually me in the background, "Tay Vaughan." I still have one of the original fuzzy photos taken that day, tiny copies spread to us all the next week. I digitized it many years ago for my own biographical website. :-)
